More than often, the services we offer will be covered by insurance, including Medicare. However, we recommend contacting your individual carrier to determine your covered benefits.

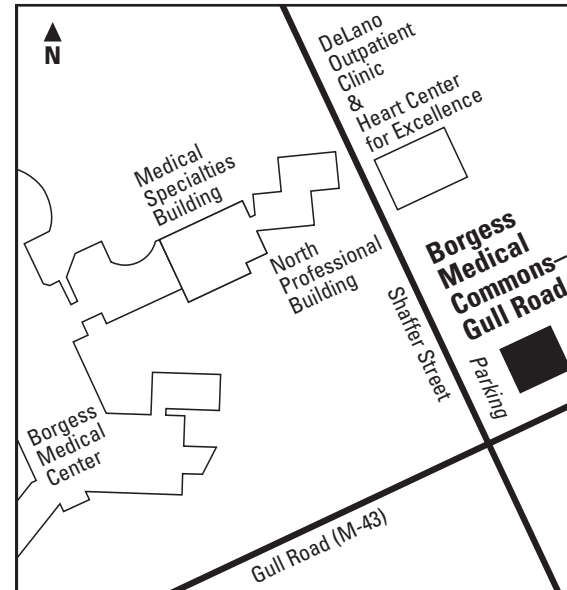

Our services include:

- Complete medical and cognitive evaluations

- Treatment of health challenges that become more common with aging, such as falls and mobility issues, depression, osteoporosis, arthritis, diabetes, heart disease, stroke, and more
